

# Community Infrastructure Levy Report 2018/19

#### Background

1. Birmingham City Council's Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) charges took effect on 4 January 2016. The council is both a charging and collecting authority. Regulation 62 of the Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations 2010 (as amended) requires CIL charging authorities to produce an annual report detailing CIL income and expenditure. This is the fourth CIL annual report and covers the period from 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019 (financial year 2018/19).

#### Allocation of CIL

- 2. CIL income is required to be allocated as follows:
  - Up to 5% of CIL can be applied towards its implementation and ongoing administration 15% (25% in areas that have a Neighbourhood Development Plan in place) of CIL is passed to the neighbourhood in which the development that paid the CIL is located for the provision of local infrastructure improvements or other measures to support the development of the area (commonly referred to as Local CIL).
  - 80% (70% in areas that have a Neighbourhood Development Plan in place) of CIL is to be applied to strategic infrastruc \* tegic egic st
